B. Course Objectives and Learning Outcomes

1. Course Description

This is a three hour course that builds on "Writing I & II". It focuses on the content, structure, and organization of academic essays. Students work to correctly incorporate research into essays. Advanced sentence structures, summarizing, paraphrasing, and proof reading skills are addressed. The main aim of this course is to upgrade students' skills in academic writing conventions, and equip them with a firm understanding of the process of writing a research paper at the graduate level.

2. Course Main Objective

- Introduce elements of an essay
- Lay foundation for writing an essay including introduction, body paragraphs and conclusion
- Present common organizational patterns in formal essay writing
- Prepare students to write timed essays to encounter class room or exam situations
- Guide students through analysis, revision and editing essays

Encourage students to make connection between thinking and writing
