





Figure 5 : Grade distribution analysis Level 3 (Old Plan)-20201 Most of the students achieved D+ and D grades. Over all 8 students were failed. Detailed grade distribution of level 3 students (old plan) for 1st semester 20201 is shown in Figure 5.



Detailed grade distribution of level 5 students for 1st semester is shown in Figure 7.




Figure 8 : Grade distribution analysis Level 6 -20201







Figure 9 : Grade distribution analysis Level 7 -20201 The grade distribution is even among all grades. Over all 8 students were failed. Detailed grade distribution of level 7 students for 1st semester is shown in Figure 9.




Figure 17: Grade distribution analysis Level 7 -20202.




Figure 19: Comparison of pass percentage for first and second semester 2019-20.




